CASINO ACTION: Comedy Stop shows off 'Pretty, Funny Women'

The Comedy Stop at the Tropicana always does a great job bringing in very funny comedians. But this week, it's even better.

Owner Bob Kephart was so taken by the show, "Pretty, Funny Women," that he reached a little deeper into his pockets than usual and booked the female stand-up comedy show after peak season.

"It was the only open dates we had," Kephart says, "But I really wanted them. So I brought them in. They are great, The way they play off of each other is really funny. They are all women, but they all have conflicting opinions of certain things ... they make fun of each other. They are some of the best female comics working today."

"Pretty, Funny Women," which is at the Comedy Stop through Sunday, Sept. 9, is the longest running, all-female stand-up comedy show in the country. Created by Lisa Sundstedt, the show has been running strong in several venues for more than 10 years. The women are edgy, sexy and, most importantly, funny.

The five-woman show features the comedians doing their best 20 minutes. Irreverent and smart, the show appeals to women because it's smart, honest, hysterical and relatable. Men also like it because it's just genuinely funny.

Starring Sunstedt, Heather McDonald, Shawn Pelofsky, Jody Ferdig and Vicki Barbolac, the women's resumes cross all entertainment mediums from the Cartoon Network's "Robot Chicken" to "Malcolm in the Middle" and others. Barbolac was the 2007 winner of Nickelodeon's "Funniest Mom in America."

Showtimes are 10 p.m. Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday, 9 and 11:15 p.m. Friday and Saturday. Tickets are \$23, \$26 for Saturday's shows.
